The Gruffalo and The Gruffalo's Child are the books we have been reading in class. Each morning we practice writing sentences relating to these stories. Here are some pictures of our work.

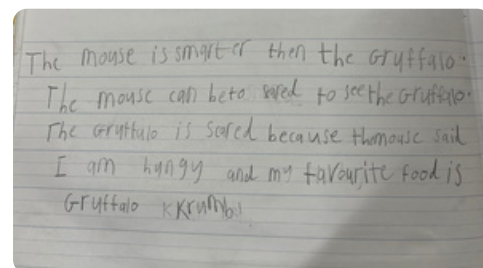
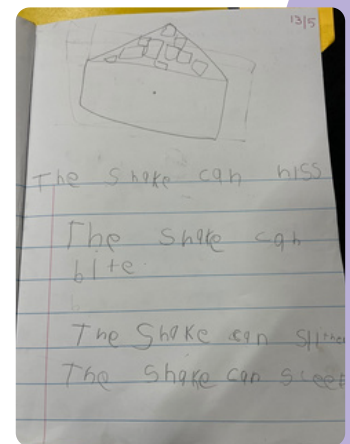
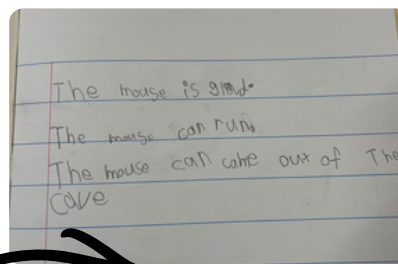
Mildura Field Day

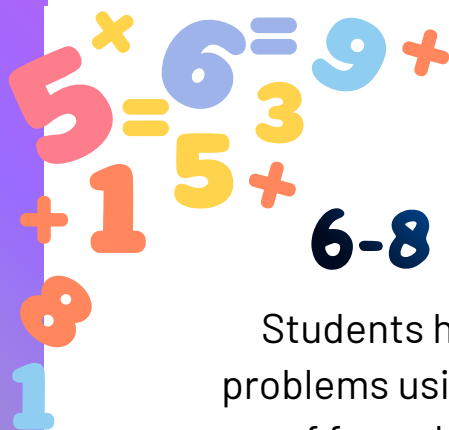


ANNUAL FIELD DAY

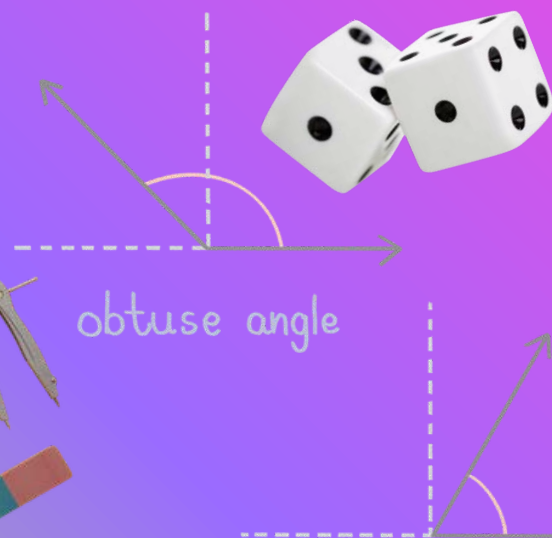
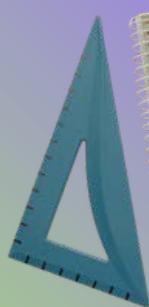
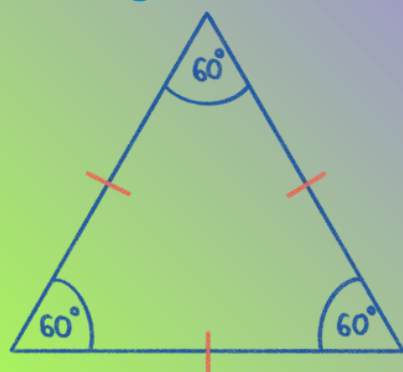
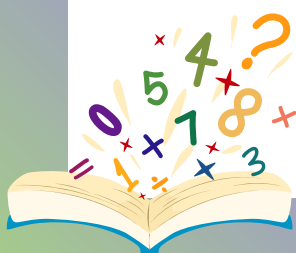


6-8 Maths

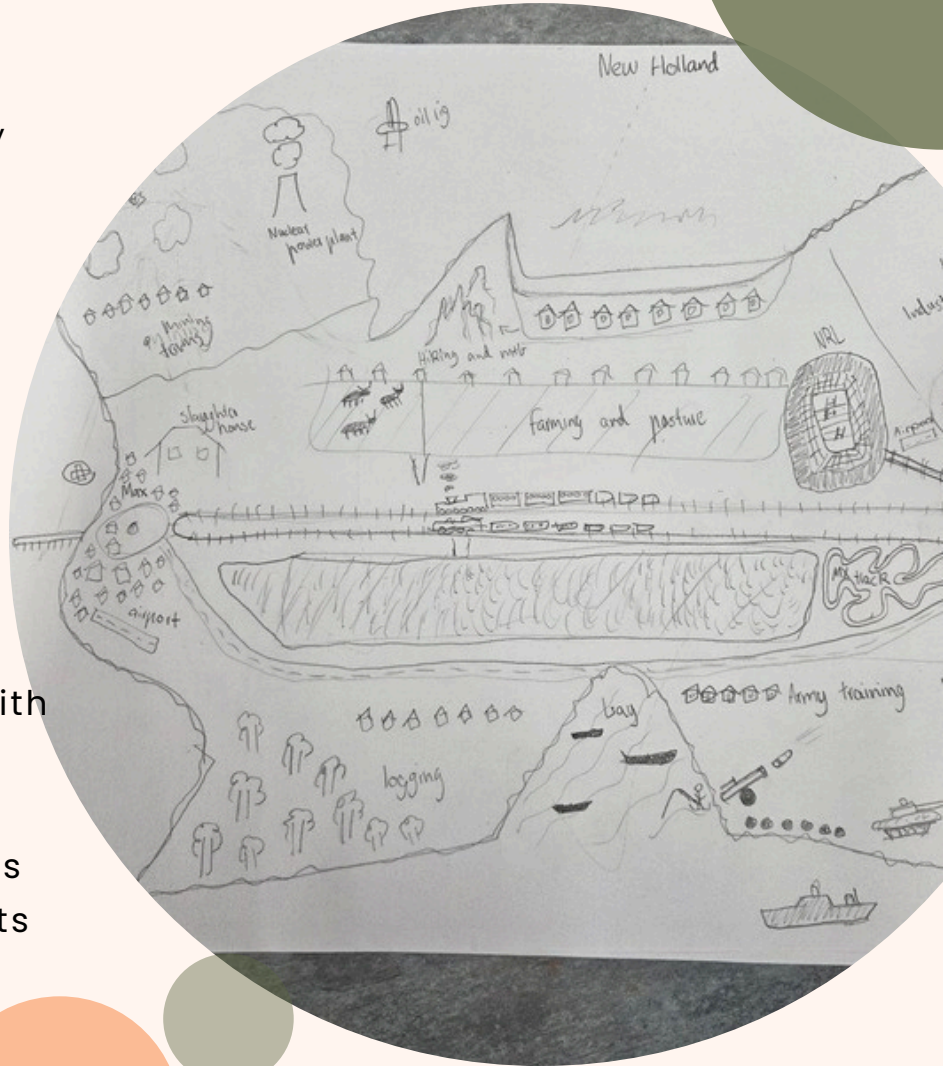

9-10 SCIENCE

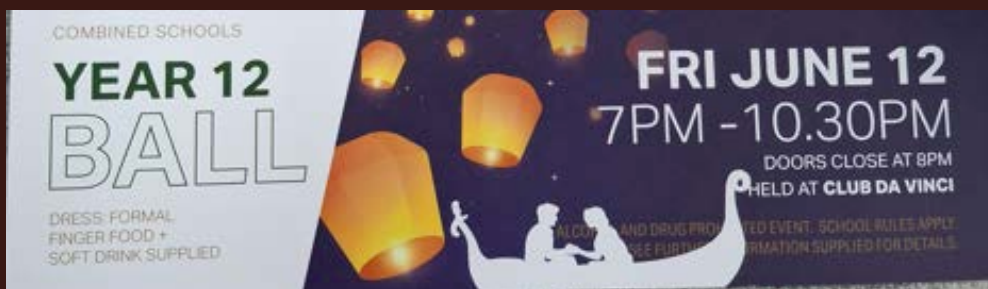
