Last week of Term

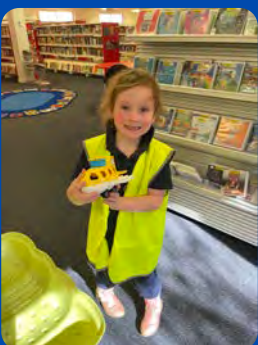

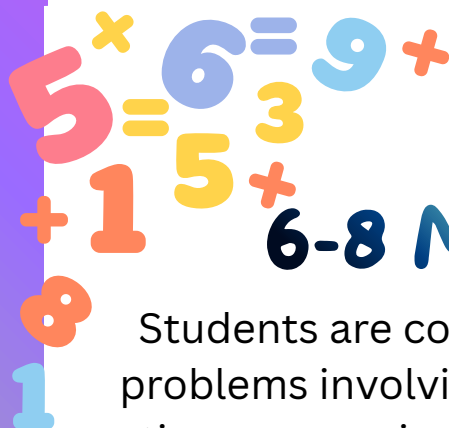

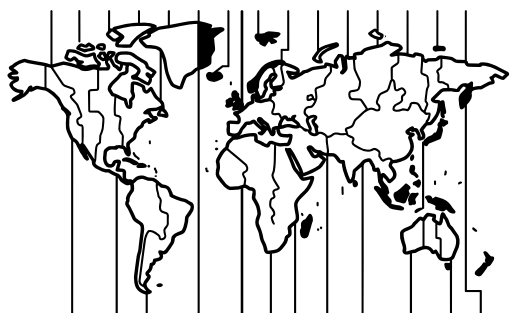

Students are continuing to solve problems involving TIME including time conversions, 12 to 24h time and time-zones in Australia and around the world.



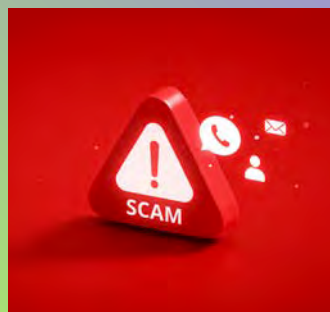
9/10 Maths

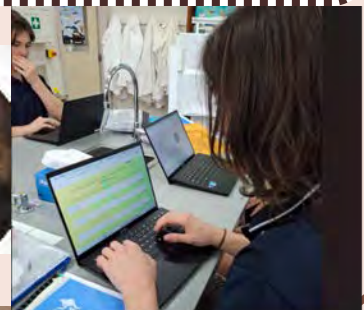
9-10 SCIENCE

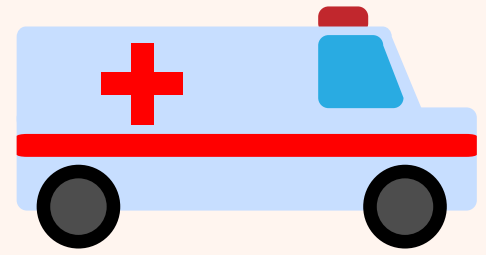
Winter
