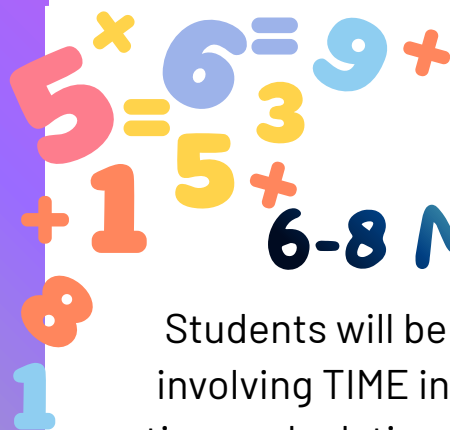
Home Reading

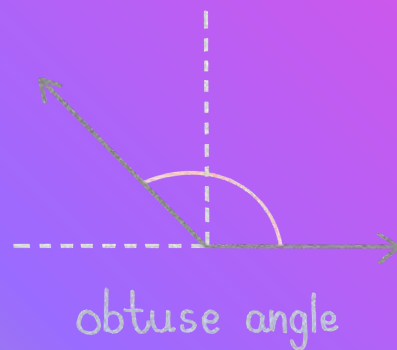
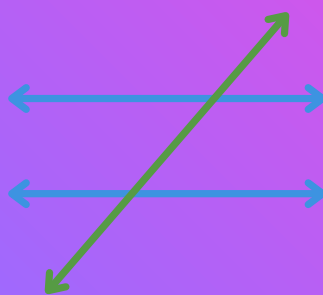
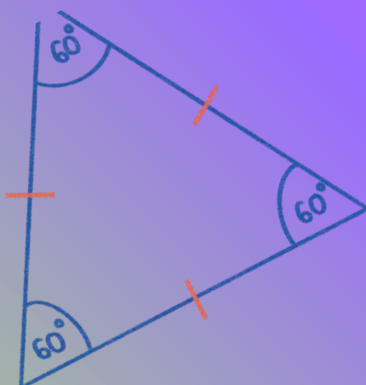
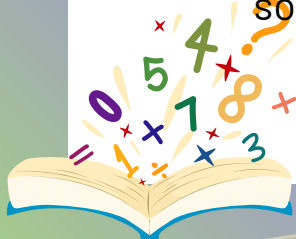
6-8 Maths

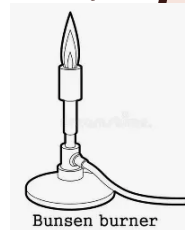
9/10 ENGLISH

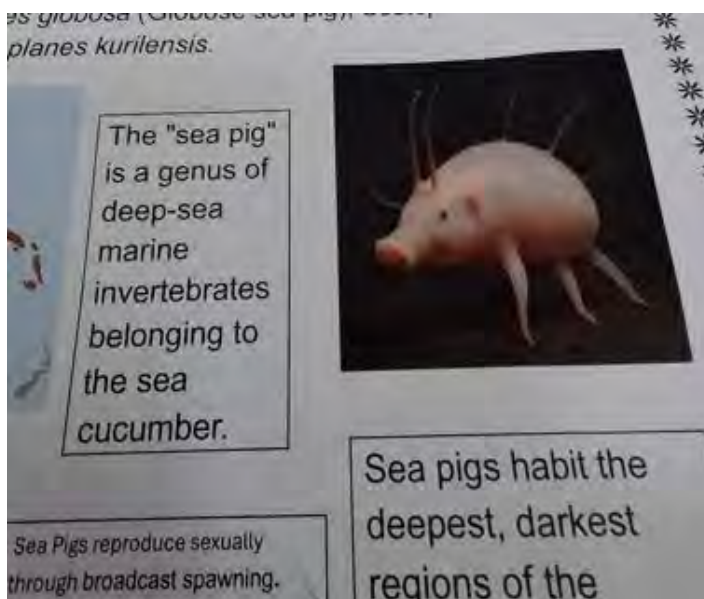

9-10 SCIENCE

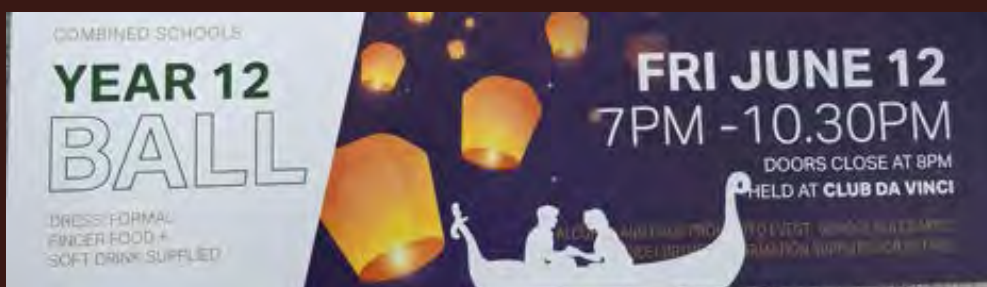

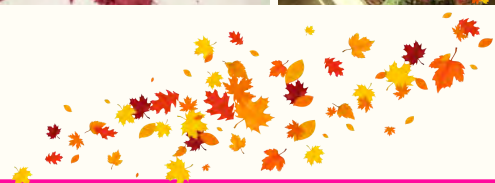
